

Dear Residents of SD-44:

On Friday, Montgomery, Chester, and Berks Counties will move to the yellow phase of the reopening plan, as outlined by Governor Wolf. Late last week, Governor Wolf announced updated guidance for restaurants that includes dine-in service in outdoor seating areas so long as they strictly adhere to the requirements of the guidance, including maximum occupancy limits. I am hopeful that we will see additional guidelines and additional Personal Protective Equipment that will permit other industries such as barbershops, salons, and pet grooming services to resume in the near future.

Earlier this week, the Senate voted on a partial state budget (<u>HB2387</u>) that included a \$25

billion spending plan. I voted NO on the general appropriation bill since it did not account for a multi-billion dollar revenue gap.

I know that my constituents have suffered immensely due to the economic effects that the

pandemic has had on our region. I was one of only 6 Senators to vote against the spending plan as it did not meet the needs of the hardworking people and families of my district. I do, however, appreciate and acknowledge the Governor's commitment to education, which over the last six years, has seen funding boosts every year and will not see cuts in state funding during this unprecedented time.

In more positive news, the Senate voted 50-0 to allocate \$2.6 billion in one-time, federal

funding to help workers, families, and businesses impacted by COVID-19 in Pennsylvania.

I am thankful that this allocation reflects the priorities that the Democratic Caucus laid out

in our PA CARES Plan in April.


