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Dear Residents of SD-44:

Last Friday, Governor Wolf <u>announced</u> that the state has been working with the federal government to set up 27 federal vaccine program sites in the commonwealth. The announcement also laid out plans which included three key areas (listed below). While some of these announcements are welcome changes that I have been calling for both <u>publicly</u> and privately in calls with the DOH and the Administration, I am still concerned by the lack of clarity and transparency relative to allocation data and the lack of commitment to establish multiple regional sites in each of the collar counties, which have been shortchanged thus far.

Both Montgomery and Chester counties have the capacity to quickly distribute vaccine doses via mass vaccination sites in communities across our region, but currently they are not receiving enough supply to do so. It is imperative that we have accessible mass vaccination sites in both Western Montgomery County and throughout Northern and Western Chester County and I continue to work with the County Commissioners across Senate District 44 to ensure that our communities are prioritized.

See below for the updates announced by the Governor:

- Scheduling vaccine appointments for those in Phase 1A who are still seeking a vaccination. The Secretary of Health will be issuing an Order that will require vaccine providers to make best efforts to schedule all 1A appointments by the end of the month. To assist them in achieving this goal, the state will be providing greater visibility into their future allocations. This will allow them to schedule appointments with confidence in having sufficient supply to keep those appointments.
- Establishing Regional Vaccination Clinics using a portion of the weekly allocation of Johnson & Johnson vaccine doses after the completion of the special initiative to vaccinate teachers, school staff and child care workers. This will be made available to regions and counties throughout the commonwealth. Targeting frontline workers and first responders using a portion of J&J doses.
- Targeted industries include law enforcement/correctional staff, grocery workers, firefighters (both career and volunteer), meat processing and agriculture workers. Using the J&J supply to support regionally planned and facilitated mass vaccination sites, as well as quickly completing vaccine missions for critical frontline workers means more shots in arms while helping our seniors secure appointments and receive their vaccine before more broadly opening up to additional populations. My office continues to help senior citizens and other constituents who may be having

difficulty registering for a vaccine appointment, due to a number of factors like not having an email address.

COVID-19 Vaccine for Pre-K to 12 School

Staff Last Wednesday, Governor Wolf <u>announced</u> that the state will allocate their first allocation (94,600 doses) of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine starting with staff that have regular and

sustained in-person contact with students during the regular school day, including teachers and staff providing pre-k and elementary instruction, special education, English learners and associated support staff. In a call last Tuesday with the DOH and PEMA, I pressed for answers as to whether or not our region would be prioritized given that our schools have been shut down considerably longer than other areas of the state. It is critical that our children are back in school and

vaccinating our teachers and support staff quickly is a big step in making that a reality. There will be at least one vaccination site per IU region. School staff will be directed to the vaccination site in the region within which their school is located. The Pennsylvania National Guard and AMI, a health organization contracted by DOH, will direct operations and administer doses at these sites. Each vaccination site is expected to begin operations


