Your vote, your voice: Make your ballot count!

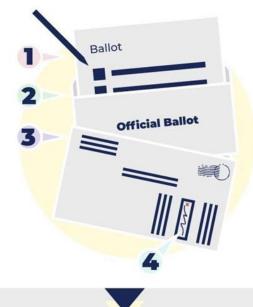

Concerning COVID Resurgence in PA

New numbers released by Pennsylvania health officials paint a concerning picture of the fall resurgence in coronavirus. The Department of Health reports that we have seen more than 1,000 cases a day for the past nine days, bringing the statewide total above 177,000.

Pennsylvanians play a critical role in helping to reduce the spread of COVID-19:

- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available.
- Cover any coughs or sneezes with your elbow, not your hands.
- Clean surfaces frequently.
