

The Pennsylvania Supreme Court extended the state's mail ballot deadlines last

State law says mail ballots must be received by 8 p.m. on Election Day, but the high court said Thursday that ballots will be counted if they are received by 5 p.m. the Friday after the Nov. 3 election. To count, ballots arriving after Election Day must either be postmarked by Nov. 3 or have no proof they were sent afterward. Ballots that arrive

by the new deadline with missing or illegible postmarks would still be counted. In addition, the court held that state election law allows counties to use drop boxes for hand delivery of mail ballots; denied requests to allow poll watchers to work in counties other than the ones where they are registered; and denied a request that other people be


