Legislative Updates

Standing up against efforts to suppress the vote

Last week the Senate State Government committee convened to vote on HB2626; legislation which uses the word "security" to hide the fact that it suppresses voters. This meeting was also not brought to the attention of the members of the committee until 8:21pm of the night before and did not appear on the Senate's public schedule by Wednesday afternoon.

I hoped to amend the bill to extend the pre-canvassing timeline for counties, giving them three weeks to prepare mail-in ballots for tallying ahead of Election Day, and to preserve the Oct. 27 deadline for voters to request mail-in ballots.

Due to an <u>administrative error</u> that led to a violation of the Sunshine Act, which requires public notification of the meeting, the meeting was voided and a "re-do" will be held today.

Lost Wage Assistance (LWA) Program


The federal Lost Wages Assistance (LWA) Program gives Pennsylvania \$1.5 billion to provide an extra \$300 a week in additional funds to individuals that are unemployed (or partially unemployed) because of COVID-19.

LWA Program Eligibility

- You must be fully or partially unemployed due to COVID-19, and
- You must have a weekly benefit rate + dependent allowance totaling \$100 or more, and
- You must receive a payment each week from one of the qualifying programs:
 - Unemployment Compensation
 - Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation
 - Pandemic Unemployment Assistance
 - State Extended Benefits
 - Shared-Work
 - Trade Readjustment Allowances

You will certify only ONCE for the LWA program. Complete your LWA Certification as soon as possible as funds are limited and not guaranteed.

Starting Sunday, Sept. 6, individuals should fill out their LWA certification using their UC PIN by selecting "**Complete LWA Certification**" in the <u>same application used to file biweekly claims.</u>
