Emergency Rent Assistance Program (ERAP)

The Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) was created to help renters dealing with financial challenges related to the COVID-19 pandemic. For eligible households, the program offers **rental and utility assistance** to help Pennsylvanians avoid eviction or loss of utility service.

ERAP was established by the Consolidated Appropriations Act 2021. Governor Wolf signed Act 1 of 2021 into law on February 5, 2021 allowing the Department of Human Services (DHS) to implement and administer ERAP in accordance with federal guidelines.

Emergency Rent Assistance Program (ERAP)

Am I Eligible For The ERAP Program?

For a household* to be eligible for the ERAP program, it must meet the requirements below:

- One or more individuals in the household has qualified for unemployment benefits or experienced a reduction in household income, incurred significant costs, or experienced other financial hardship due, directly or indirectly, to the COVID-19 pandemic, AND
- The household can demonstrate a risk of homelessness or housing instability,
 AND
- Household must be at or below 80% of Area Median Income at the time of application. (Based on County of Residence)

^{*}ERAP is only available for renters

Emergency Rent Assistance Program (ERAP)

What Documents Will I Need To Apply?

- A copy of your lease, if you have one. If you don't, please find some sort of proof of consistent rental payments at that address, such as bank statements, or utility bills with your name and rental address on it. A letter from the landlord will also suffice.
- Some sort of photo identification.
- An overdue rent or utility notice, if applicable. This can come from your landlord or a utility service like PECO.
- Current income documentation for all ADULTS in your household. This
 includes things like pay stubs, Tax documents (1040), W-2 forms or bank
 statements.
- Proof that you receive or applied for unemployment, if applicable.

Homelessness Chester / Montgomery

Coordinated entry is a streamlined process for individuals or families that are experiencing housing crisis or homelessness to be screened for eligibility in housing programs. (Examples: Rapid re-housing or shelter)

Programs and eligibility vary county to county.

Those experiencing homelessness or housing crisis in **Chester** and **Montgomery County** should call **211** for screening and direct referral to eligible services.
